# HIV & AIDS in Liverpool, 2014

- In 2014, **537** HIV positive Liverpool residents accessed treatment and care from statutory treatment centres in Cumbria, Lancashire, Greater Manchester and Liverpool.
- **Heterosexual sex** continues to be the predominant mode of exposure (**54%**) for all Liverpool residents
- Those from **BME groups** made up **43%** of HIV positive residents accessing treatment and care
- **Non-UK nationals** accounted for **38%** of all cases. Ninety one percent of non-UK nationals were classed as asylum seekers and half (50%) were female

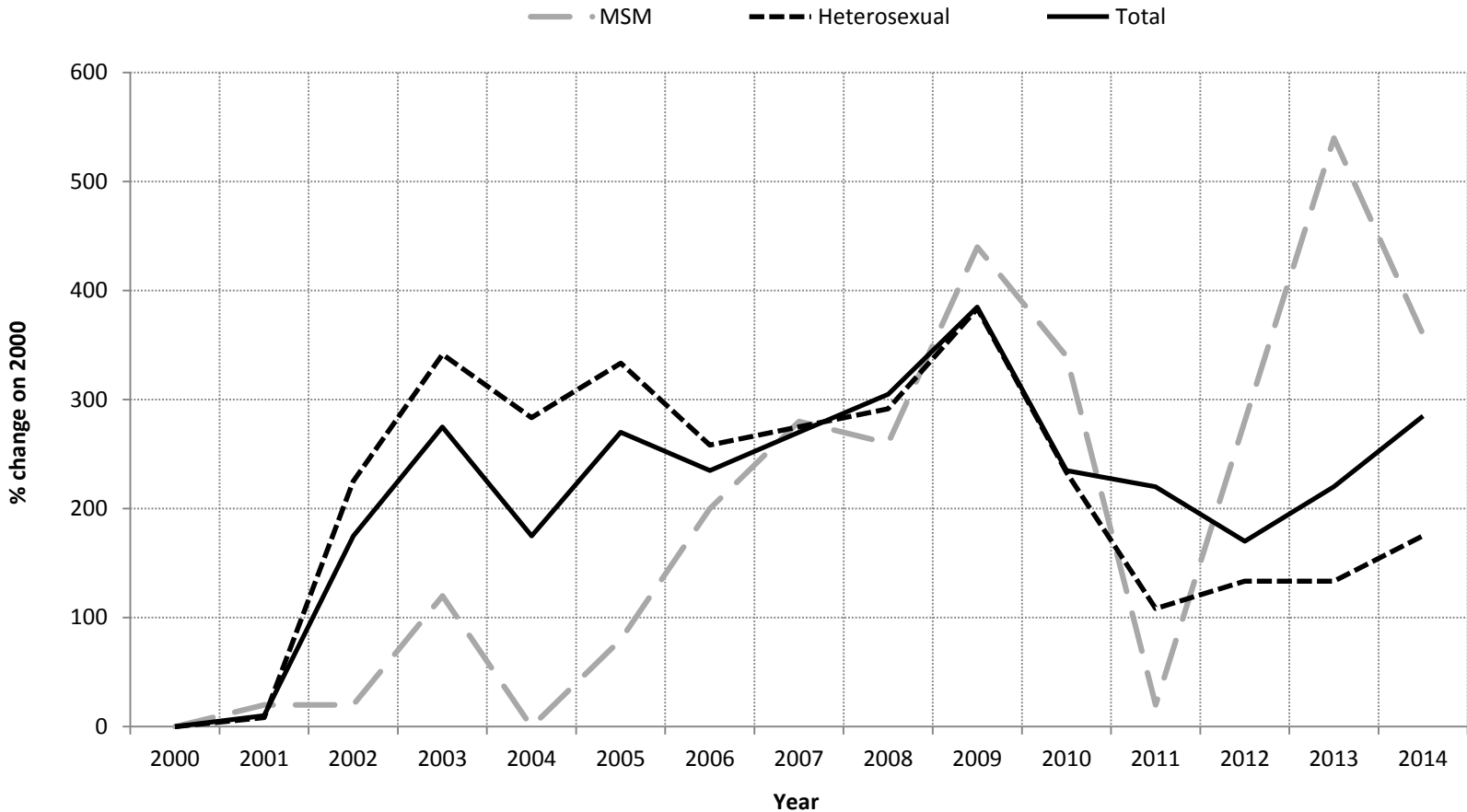


# New HIV cases, Liverpool, 2014

- There were **77 new cases** of HIV reported among Liverpool residents in 2014
- New cases represented **14%** of those accessing treatment and care in 2014
- The dominant mode of exposure (**43%**) for new cases is **heterosexual sex**
- The largest proportion of new cases were **asymptomatic (86%)**. The number of new cases diagnosed with AIDS by the end of 2014 was low (3%) and there were no deaths among Liverpool new cases.
